- 2. Northern California The need for intellectual property litigators grew at all levels. Lawyers with a technical background will do great in this region.
- 3. Northwest Attorneys specializing in corporate, employment and labor are in a good position here, while those in real estate law are going to find very few openings.
- 4. Northeast The DC market has seen some growth in healthcare and energy related attorney jobs. Finance and corporate are making a comeback in New York.
- 5. Southwest The market is overall in a slump, with litigation doing relatively well compared to all the other areas.
- 6. Midwest Hiring has decreased in the fourth quarter in Chicago.
